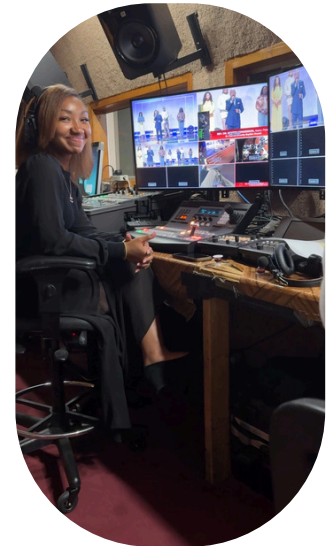

The Conversation Before the Conversation: Why How You Show Up Changes Everything by Vanessa Miller

Most conversations don't break down because of what's said. They break down because of how we show up before a single word is spoken. As entrepreneurs, creators, and leaders in our own right, we're constantly navigating conversations that matter—setting boundaries, managing expectations, negotiating value, and making decisions that impact our time, money, and energy. Here's what often gets overlooked: By the time we open our mouths, we've already decided something internally. We've made assumptions. We've judged the situation. We've predicted the outcome.

And all of that shows up—in our tone, our body language, and the words we choose. Think about a moment when a client questioned your price, or someone didn't meet your expectations. Before you responded, something likely ran through your mind: *They don't value me. This always happens. I need to fix this quickly.* That internal reaction shapes the conversation more than the words themselves. This is where SHIFTEd Conversations™ begins.

It starts with a simple but powerful question: **Am I thinking clearly, or reacting quickly?** That question creates a *choice point*—a moment where you can pause and decide how you want to show up instead of defaulting to habit. In my work, I use a framework called **SHIFT**:

- **Set Intention** – What outcome actually matters here?
- **Hear Their Truth** – What's really being said, beyond the surface?
- **Identify the Issue** – What's the real challenge, not just the visible tension?
- **Find Alignment** – Where is there common ground or shared interest?
- **Take Action** – What's the next clear, accountable step?

This isn't about having the “perfect words.” It's about creating the conditions for a better conversation. Because when you slow down your thinking, you listen differently, respond with more clarity, and make stronger decisions. In spaces like ours—where collaboration, visibility, and growth matter—how we show up in conversations shapes what becomes possible.

So the next time you find yourself in a moment that matters, pause and ask: **Am I thinking clearly... or reacting quickly?** Because how you answer that question will shape not just the conversation— but the outcome that follows.

NOTABLE, HISTORICALLY UNDERRECOGNIZED BLACK DESIGNERS:

- Ann Cole Lowe (1898–1981): A talented couturier, she designed Jacqueline Bouvier's wedding dress for her 1953 marriage to John F. Kennedy, though she was not publicly credited at the time. She was the first African American to become a noted fashion designer, despite facing racism throughout her career.
- Zelda Wynn Valdes (1905–2001): Opened "Chez Zelda" in 1948, the first Black-owned boutique in Manhattan on Broadway. She designed for icons like Ella Fitzgerald, Josephine Baker, and Mae West, and designed the original Playboy bunny suit.
- Jay Jaxon (1940s–2006): A pioneering American designer who worked in Paris for prestigious couture houses like Yves Saint Laurent and Christian Dior before launching his own label.
- Stephen Burrows (b. 1943): A dazzling 1970s talent known for his vibrant, color-blocked jersey dresses with "lettuce hems." He was one of the first Black designers to achieve international fame, yet often omitted in earlier fashion histories.
- Willi Smith (1948–1987): Often considered the most successful Black fashion designer in history, Smith pioneered "street couture" and designed the clothes for the wedding of Mary Jane Watson and Peter Parker in Marvel comics.
- Ruby Bailey (1906–1989): A contemporary of Valdes, she was a Harlem-based designer known for her work in textiles, print, and custom clothing.
- Patrick Kelly (1954–1990): The first American and Black designer to be admitted into the prestigious Chambre Syndicale du Prêt-à-Porter in Paris.
- Oluwole Olumuyiwa, John Owusu-Addo, & Demas Nwoko: 20th-century West African architects who proved the value of using local customs, resources, and materials.

TOP LATIN AMERICAN FASHION DESIGNERS

- Óscar de la Renta (Dominican Republic)- Without a doubt, the first name that comes to mind, the designer born in Santo Domingo, is one of the most influential fashion designers in history. He became famous in the 1960s for dressing First Lady Jackie Kennedy and began with a great legacy in history, his name is not only known in Latin America, the name of Oscar de la Renta means elegance, history and culture.

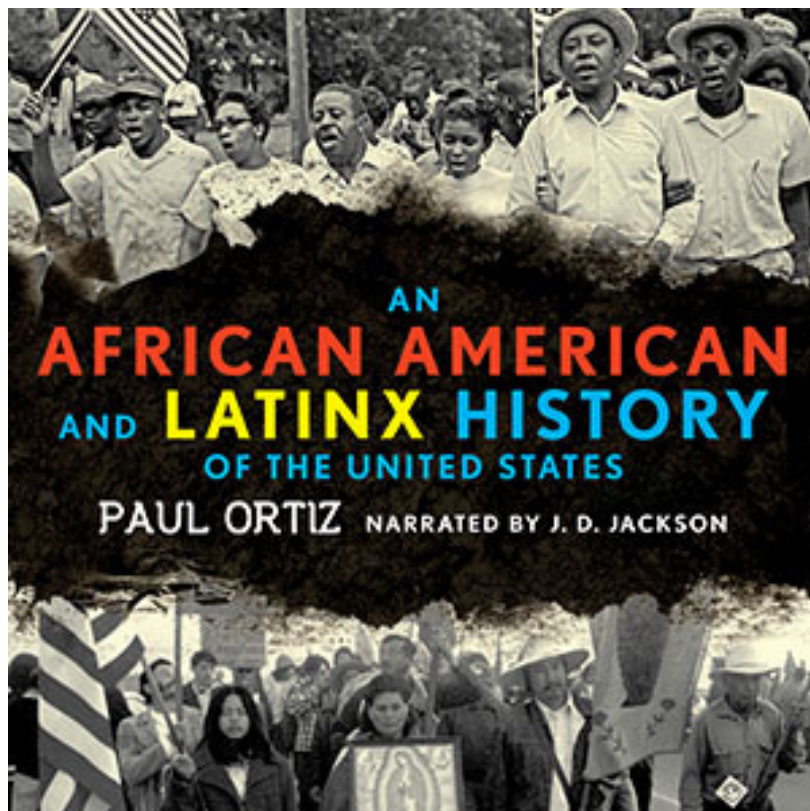
- **Isabel Toledo (Cuba).** Isabel Toledo is undoubtedly one of the greatest designers in the history of Latin fashion, obsessed with pattern structures, and Toledo forms described her work as "mathematical romantics". Isabel Toledo had an education in one of the most prestigious fashion schools in the world, at the Fashion Institute of Technology. In 2005 she received the National Design Award, had a successful career and was acclaimed by top fashion critics. In 2008 she dressed Michelle Obama for President Barack Obama's inauguration.
- **Carolina Herrera (Venezuela).** Talking about Latin fashion without the name Carolina Herrera would not make sense. Although part of her career and successes were indeed achieved outside her country, the name Carolina Herrera represents Latin American fashion. Her elegant and timeless style led her to position her brand as one of the best in Latin America, like Oscar de la Renta, Carolina Herrera designed dresses for the First Lady, Jackie Kennedy.
- **Narciso Rodriguez is a designer of Cuban origin,** known in the fashion world for its purist aesthetics, After studying fashion design at the prestigious Parsons School of Design in New York, he worked with Donna Karan at Anne Klein and later Calvin Klein. In October 1997, Narciso Rodriguez began his own firm. And in 1998, he presented his first collection at Milan Fashion Week. Years later, he was in charge of the creative direction of the Loewe brand. He is one of the most important designers and one of the representatives of minimalist fashion. He designed her friend Carolyn Bessette's wedding dress for her marriage to John F. Kennedy Jr.
- **Miguel Mesa Posada (Colombia).** While we have talked about classic and historical designers, some names deserve to be mentioned in this list. One of them is that the designer Miguel Mesa Posada known as "the fashion anthropologist" himself describes his work as an intense search for answers on Latin American interpretations of truth/wealth/beauty through apparel experimentation. Historical fiction and facts are a basis for recreating a conversation between the present and the past. Miguel is mainly inspired by his native Colombia, field life, and the historical value of archaeology.
- **Carla Fernandez (México).** With an extraordinary vision, focused on Mexican origin and cultural wealth, Carla Fernández is one of the designers who could not stay off this list. A sustainable fashion brand characterized by working together with Mexican artisans and indigenous communities. Its design is based on traditional geometric shapes, organic materials, and processing techniques from all over the country. In 2008, during London Fashion Week, she was named "young fashion entrepreneur". Carla not only represents an avant-garde style of Mexican fashion but is the spokesperson for a culture, a nation, and all those artisans who color her creations.

- **Sebastian del Real Ossa (Chile).** Perhaps the designer with the fewest reflectors of this list, a designer completely "unknown" to many, but with one of the freshest and most innovative proposals in Latin American fashion. Born in Santiago de Chile and raised in a loving family, Sebastian began his love of fashion thanks to his mother, whom he has defined on different occasions as his greatest inspiration. Sebastian del Real Ossa started with his brand in 2005, intending to create refined women's costumes for exclusive clients, one of the most interesting features of the brand is that his collections continue to be made in the workshop of his house and he himself has mentioned that his mother is part of the creative process.
