MMSI Celebrates Black History Month Lesley Gist-Etheridge ~ In Honor of Women





Mrs. Gist came to MMSI's attention via her Facebook page which highlights African American History. It is a page that everyone should "like" and share with others, especially children and teachers.

Mrs. Gist is the author of *The Gist of Freedom is Still Faith* which tells of the journey of William Still, a Black abolitionist

from Philadelphia. The New York Times as coined Mr. Still as "The Father of the Underground Railroad". He commissioned Harriet Tubman's rescue missions and literally wrote the



Underground Railroad book.

<u>The Gist of Freedom is</u> <u>Still Faith</u> traces several tremendous people and

stories within the world of the abolitionist movement. and the Underground Railroad. Still's tells of his poverty, prosperity, and philanthropy. His work as an abolitionist permitted him to unknowingly have the miraculous reunion between his lost enslaved brother. Peter Gist and their mother Charity. The Still and Gist family legacies tell of a story of triumph in the midst of one of history's most horrific indignities.
